

The Organiser/Operator of this event is The Liverpool Motor Club Ltd. (LMC)

Motorsport is Dangerous and Can Involve Injury or Death.

Despite the organisers taking all reasonable precautions, accidents can happen. By attending a track day, you acknowledge this and confirm that you are aware of the nature of the activity and attend at the venue at your own risk.

LMC may refuse access to, and eject from, the venue any persons who are acting against the interests of safety and/or whose behaviour is likely to cause damage, nuisance or injury.

Neither LMC nor any members/representatives of LMC are responsible for any loss, damage or injury to persons or property caused or sustained by you as result of attendance at this event.

Event Rules and Site Regulations

Driver Requirements

All drivers must be at least 18 years of age, hold at least one of the following licences and comply with the relevant rules and regulations in order to take part in the trackday: Photocopies will not be accepted.

DVLA road licence - must be a full, unrestricted (not provisional or suspended), valid driving licence issued by the DVLA (or the equivalent foreign licensing authority in the driver's country of residence) with the appropriate category clearly indicated covering motor cars.

Competition licence - must be a current Motorsport UK RS Clubman (or higher) car driver's licence.

Equipment Requirements

All drivers and passengers must wear a suitable, correctly fitting crash helmet and have their arms & legs covered at all times whilst on circuit. Fire resistant clothing is strongly recommended. All drivers & passengers in open top vehicles must wear full face helmets, with visor or goggles. Only helmets complying with the following standards are considered suitable: FIA 8860-2004, FIA 8860-2010, FIA 8859-2015, SA2010, SA2015, SAH2010, SA2020.

You are responsible for your own safety and ensuring your clothing and helmet are fit for purpose.

Anyone carrying a passenger in a car is solely responsible for appropriate Covid-19 precautions, including ensuring both occupants wear full face helmets or helmet plus face coverings whilst in the vehicle, unless both occupants reside at the same address.

Vehicle Requirements

The vehicle you intend to use must conform to UK MOT minimum standards for road use (in the case of road cars), or Motorsport UK current safety and silencing regulations. It must be in good condition both mechanically and bodily and suitable for its intended use on the track. It is your duty to ensure that the vehicle remains in this condition for the duration of the activity in the interests of your safety and the safety of others at the circuit.

Slick (untreaded) tyres are only permitted on cars fitted with rollover protection (ie a Roll Cage)

Cars must have towing points of adequate strength at both front & rear identified using a contrasting colour.

We recommend that a serviceable 'AFFF' fire extinguisher is securely fitted within reach of the driver.

Noise Restrictions

Your vehicle will be subjected to, and must pass, a static noise test of 105dB(a) maximum measured 0.5m from the exhaust with the engine running at 75% of maximum revs. If the organiser is of the opinion that a vehicle does not comply with this noise restriction, or appears to be excessively noisy whilst on the circuit, the vehicle will be prevented from participating in the remainder of the event unless the noise emissions are addressed to bring them within an acceptable limit.

Drive-by noise tests may also be performed; cars must not exceed 92dB(a) at 20m distance anywhere on the circuit.

Accident Damage and Insurance

LMC does not require you to have insurance cover in place on its track days. However by using your car on track you do so at your own risk. You may consider obtaining cover from one of the specialist insurers who offer track day insurance to cover third party, personal and own vehicle risks. In the event of a car going off the Circuit and damaging the grass or 'hardware' of the adjacent Grand National or Golf Courses, the driver of the vehicle involved may become liable for the first £250 of any damage to the venue.

Who can you bring with you? - Important restrictions

Spectators are not being admitted to this event. Each main driver will be allowed to bring up to three supporters, one second driver and up to two passengers, all of whom must be declared to the operator prior to the event. Everyone attending the event must be declared on our signing-on forms. Anyone attempting to gain access who has not been declared to the operator prior to the event will be refused admission.

On arrival, attendees names will be checked and windscreen stickers and wristbands will be issued.

Briefing

Please read the attached driver's briefing before leaving home. If you do not understand any part of the briefing, please contact our track day coordinator for guidance.

Passengers

Only one passenger in the vehicle at any one time. All passengers must have been declared on the initial booking application. All fitted safety devices must be able to perform within their manufacturers guidelines i.e. weight and height of passenger must not interfere or prevent such safe operation within the manufacturers design parameters.

Passengers under the age of 18 are not being permitted at this event. We hope this restriction can be lifted in 2022.

On Track and in the Pit Lane

Sessions are 10 minutes long, but may be subject to amendment if there's an incident.

Seat belts/harnesses must continue be worn at all times on the circuit, until the car re-enters the paddock at the end of a session.

You must show your wristband to the paddock exit officials before going out on track every time.

Participants must not act or drive recklessly, dangerously or in an intimidating fashion, whether on track or otherwise.

If in the organiser's opinion you are acting dangerously, recklessly or in an intimidating fashion you may be removed from further participation in the track day and/or ejected from the venue at the organiser's discretion, without recourse.

Overtaking is allowed only on the left, and never in corners.

Yellow flag or flashing light = Caution, slow down, no overtaking, incident ahead.

Red flag or red lights = session has been stopped, slow down, no overtaking, be prepared to stop. Follow marshals' instructions

No participant shall consume or be under the influence of alcohol or drugs at any time during the track day.

No participant shall be under the influence of drugs or medication (prescribed or otherwise) or have any pre-existing medical condition that might adversely affect his or her performance during the track day.

No pregnant drivers or passengers will be permitted to participate in the track day. No timekeeping or pace-making is allowed.

It is strongly recommended that open top cars are fitted with a full Motorsport UK/FIA approved rollover protection system, or other road homologated roll-over safety device.

Participants must comply with to all briefings and safety instructions throughout the track day, including flags, signals or warnings from marshals or any other representative of the operator. The decisions of the operator are final.

No paddock bikes, scooters, or other forms of unlicensed transport are to be used on the venue at any time.

No animals may be brought into the venue, except registered guide dogs which must be kept on a lead at all times.

Cameras

Any on-board camera equipment must be safely and securely mounted inside the vehicle, not externally, in a manner that cannot cause injury to the occupants in the event of an incident. Hand held cameras and camera phones must not be used in vehicles.

The use of drones is prohibited at the venue during the event.

Cancelling your booking

If you wish to cancel, your booking fee will be returned less a £10 processing charge, provided written notice of withdrawal (by letter or email) is received by the organisers not less than 10 days prior to the commencement of the event. If notice is received less than 10 days prior to the event, the organisers reserve the right not to make a refund unless a replacement booking is received.

General Information

Food: Hot and cold snacks, drinks etc are available from 8am in the Golf Centre. **Drivers must not consume alcohol.**

Environment: Aintree is a sensitive site. Please place litter in the bins provided, or take it home with you. There are no facilities for the disposal of oil on site, so please bring a suitable container to take any waste oil home with you.

Park all vehicles on the grass, clear of the roadway. The paddock road is a motorcycle training centre during the week so it is vital that any oil spills are treated immediately to avoid risk to other users. Inform us immediately if you spill any oil and we will provide materials to clean it up.

Dogs & Drones are not allowed.

Camping

There is no charge for Overnight Camping/Parking, though this is entirely at the owner's risk. There are just 10 spaces available for motorhomes/camper vans with on-board facilities. Please contact the track day coordinator to book a space. Tents are not allowed.

The circuit will be open from 4pm on Friday for overnight camping, but the gates will be locked promptly at 9.00pm and will not reopen until 6.30am on Saturday. There is no pedestrian or vehicular access or exit between these times.

You are not permitted to park in the surfaced golf centre car park until 9.00pm.
